In August, we hosted a two-day Empire State Information Fluency Continuum (ESIFC) training; earlier in the month, School Library System scholarship winners attended the Carol A. Kearney Leadership Retreat at Cornell University, which

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Common Core Connection

Librarians play an essential role in the implementation of the Common Core. Below are two key areas where librarians shine: **INQUIRY and RESEARCH**. As inquiry experts, librarians are a perfect fit for the requirements of Shift 5: Writing from Sources, as well as the new "Sub-Shifts" that focus on research, use of technology, and vocabulary. The Empire State Information Fluency Continuum (ESIFC) is a systematic approach to the inquiry process that aligns beautifully with the high

ESIFC/EngageNY alignment and applicability are not limited to high school; the scaffolded graphic organizers in the ESIFC can be used to support K-12 domains/modules that many teachers will be implementing this year.

Digital Books

The Media Library now offers access to Catalyst Digital Audiobooks and Mackin Via eBooks.

Catalist Audiobooks can be streamed online at <http://www.catalistdigital.com>, or can be checked out for offline use via a free app for Apple and Android devices. Audiobooks are single user, but can be played for an entire classroom using external speakers.

MackinVia eBooks are multiple user/simultaneous access, which means that all students in the entire region can access these books at the same time. Mackin eBooks are available online at <http://www.mackinvia.com>, or can be checked out for offline use via a free app for most devices/eReaders.

To access Catalyst and MackinVia, you must log in. Log-in credentials are on your building database lists.
