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

In it's current iteration, school libraries are included as a part of the <u>NYS Draft</u> ESSA Plan. In the draft plan, school librarians/libraries can be found on pages 16, 120, and, in most depth on pages 135-136. In this section, the draft makes mention of school librarians as leaders in curating resources, providing digital literacy instruction, providing safe spaces, and leading STEAM initiatives. In the <u>summary documen</u>t, libraries can be found on

Page 8, under "Supporting All Students/What Wil Be Different?", as well as on Page 47 and 50.

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
