Broome-Tioga BOCES is committed to providing all students with high quality, standards-based instruction. Instruction must be consistent and accessible to all students who attend a BOCES program. High quality instruction includes the targeted planning of lessons which engage students through a variety of modalities and assesses student learning on a continuous basis.

In-Person

- Teaching and learning will be consistent with a traditional in person model while maintaining all social distancing and safety protocols established by the Department of Health and NYS education department guidelines.
- Students will use google classroom as their learning platform.
- Traditional (percentage-based) grading per the existing grading policy will be used.
- Teachers will make initial contact with families via email or phone.

Students who are attending virtually will log in on-line at their regularly scheduled class time. Teachers will provide teaching and learning that meets the needs of all students.

Hybrid

- Students will use google classroom as their learning platform.
- Traditional (percentage-based) grading per the existing grading policy will be used.
- Teachers will make initial contact with families via email or phone.

Remote

- Students attending remotely will access their classroom via google classroom.
- Families will primarily be in contact with their case manager.
- > Traditional grading will apply.



In-Person

- A point of contact (case manager) will be identified for groups of students so that only one teacher will contact families (not multiple). The case manager will collaborate with the other teachers and maintain accurate information for families.
- Student attendance will be taken in person when on the BOCES campus.

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Hybrid

- Student attendance will be taken by the teacher when a student logs in via google classroom.
- Students and teachers will be required to actively participate. We encourage utilizing the video feature of Zoom during live instruction to facilitate engagement & feedback.
- Best practices for remote engagement/assessment will be used. Examples include: entrance and exit tickets, polls, breakout rooms and timely feedback on completed assignments.

Remote

- A point of contact (case manager) will be identified for groups of students so that only one teacher will contact families (not multiple). The case manager will collaborate with the other teachers and maintain accurate information for families.
- Student attendance will be taken by the teacher when a student logs in via google classroom.
- Students and teachers will be required to use the video feature when on zoom calls (no blank screens/photos).
- Best practices for remote engagement/assessment will be used. Examples include, entrance and exit tickets, polls, breakout rooms and timely feedback on completed assignments.
